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2. Course Objectives and Description

This course aims to help students read, understand, critically interpret and (re)write, and love the great 100 poems written by major British and American poets. The students will also be strongly encouraged to critically think about the themes and meanings in those poems from Christian perspectives.

This course introduces the students who love literature, poetry in particular, to the body of major British and American poetry (100 works), focusing on the themes, techniques, styles, terms, and movements. The poets discussed range from Renaissance poets like William Shakespeare (1564-1616) to the contemporary poets such as A. E. Stallings (1969-present). Diverse critical theories will be applied, such as historical, biographical, gender and feminist, Postmodernist approaches as well as Christian perspectives. Students are encouraged to participate in class discussions. This course also requires the student to write a critical essay about one or two poems and to write a creative or parodied poem.
